NOTICE

AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF CULTURE BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE STATE OF QATAR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

The Government of the State of Qatar, and The Government of the Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, hereinafter referred to as "the Parties", wishing to promote and develop mutual co-operation between the two friendly countries in the fields of culture, publications and other similar areas,

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1

The Parties will promote and facilitate cultural co-operation between their two countries by means of organizing cultural weeks and plastic arts exhibitions as well as the exchange of the visits of musical, theatrical and artistic groups.

Article 2

The Parties will exchange cultural information, issues, photos and booklets. The Parties will also promote co-operation between the national libraries of the two countries. Moreover, the Parties will encourage the participation of their national libraries and other concerned

organizations in book fairs held in the two countries.

Article 3

The Parties will encourage the translation of the newly issued cultural, artistic and literary works that may enhance their culture into each other language while taking into consideration copyright and writing regulations in the light of the international agreements and laws.

Article 4

The Two Parties shall promote efforts of mutual co-operation between different youth centers and organizations in the two countries as follows:

1. Exchange of information, researches and studies related to youth work.
2. Exchange of invitations to participate in the international youth events held in the two countries.
3. Exchange of visits of young people of the two countries to achieve understanding and to improve their knowledge.

Article 5

The Parties will form a joint committee to implement the articles of this Agreement, examine any issues that may arise during its implementation as well as concluding bilateral periodical cultural co-operation programs. The joint committee meets in the two countries alternatively on dates and in venues agreed upon via the diplomatic channels of the two countries.

Article 6

The visiting Party will bear the travel costs of its delegations to the other Party. The host Party will bear the costs of accommodation, inland

transportation and medical treatment in cases of emergency for the visiting Party in the light of the adopted legal procedures in the two countries.

Article 7

Any dispute that may arise between the Parties regarding the interpretation or implementation of this Agreement will be settled cordially through their collaboration and consultations.

Article 8

Upon a written consent of the Parties, the provisions or any of the text of this Agreement may be amended after taking the necessary legal procedures adopted in the two countries.

Article 9

This Agreement will come into force effective the date of exchanging its ratification documents according to the legal procedures adopted in the two countries and will remain valid for a period of three years subject to automatic renewal for similar period/periods unless terminated by either Party with at least a three month written notice notified via the diplomatic channels prior to its termination or its date of validity.

The termination of this Agreement will not affect any ongoing or existing programs or projects agreed upon prior to the termination notice unless otherwise agreed by the Parties.

In witness herin the two representatives of the Parties signed this Agreement by authorization from their government.
