AGREEMENT ON VISA ABOLITION FOR TOURISM OR VISIT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PLURINATIONAL STATE OF BOLIVIA AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

The Government of the Plurinational State of Bolivia and the Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, (hereinafter referred to as "the Contracting Parties"); Desirous to promote the further development of friendly relations and cooperation between the two countries;

And wishing to faciliate travels of their nationals between the two countries:

Have agreed as follows:

Article 1 THE PURPOSE

The aim of the Agreement is the abolition of Visa for tourism or visit entrance, exit transiting or stay of nationals of either Contracting Party holding valid Ordinary, Official and Diplomatic Passports for travel to the territory of the other Contracting Party without a visa and stay there for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days per year.

Article 2 ENTRY AND DEPARTURE

Nationals of one Contracting Party shall enter and leave the territory of the other Contracting Party only at the gates designated for international passengers, or authorized immigration control posts.

Article 3 COMPLIANCE WITH INTERNAL REGULATIONS

- 1. The Visa exemptions do not grant the right of the citizens of one Contracting Party to work in the territory of the other Contracting Party. Persons who wish to enter the territory of either Contracting Party with the aim to work, to carry out a profession or to study, as well as the ones who want to travel for a period more than ninety (90) days are obliged to get visas prior to arrival.
- 2. During their travels toeach other's territory, citizens of the Contracting Parties are obliged to comply with the laws in force in the territory including the laws relating to entry, residence (temporary or permanent) and the employment of, or carrying out a profession by, foreign nationals.

Article 4 PROHIBITION OF ENTRY AND MANDATORY DEPARTURE

1. Either Contracting Party reserves the right to deny entry or stay in its territory to nationals of the other Contracting Party in compliance with its laws and regulations.

Article 5 TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

1. The Contracting Parties shall exchange specimens of their valid passports through diplomatic channels.

- 2. If either Contracting Party modifies its passports, it shall transmit to the other Contracting Party, specimens of its new passports thirty (30) days before they are introduced.
- 3. The Diplomatic, Official and Ordinary Passports must have a validity of no less than six (6) months when entering the territory of one of the parties.

Article 6 SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Disputes that may arise out of the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled between the Parties, through diplomatic chnnels through consultations and negotiations.

Article 7 ENTRY INTO FORCE

1. This Agreement shall enter into force thirty (30) days from the date of its signing. Either State party may denounce this agreement at any time by written notification through diplomatic channels, and such denunciation shall be effective sixty (60) days after the receipt of such notification.

Article 8 VALIDITY

- 1. This Agreement shall enter into force thirty (30) days after its signature.
- 2. Any amendment of this Agreement agreed upon by the Contracting parties shall be effected by exchange of Notes.
- 3. This Agreement is concluded for a period of five (5) years and shall automatically renew for an equal period unless one Contracting Party notifies the other of its intention to terminate it through diplomatic channels.
- 4. Either Party may terminate this agreement at any time, for reasons of public safety, public order protection and public health, by giving sixty (60) days notice writing to the other party through the normal diplomatic channels.
